## CONQUER CANCER SUPPORT OPPORTUNITIES

### KEY INITIATIVES

#### ■ GLOBAL IMPACT FUND

Our global programs work to provide better care for patients with cancer worldwide. Together, these programs aim to develop local champions to become the leaders of tomorrow, improve the quality of care around the world through training and education, and support the innovation needed to address the global cancer crisis.

#### ■ PATIENT-CENTERED CANCER CARE

These programs provide knowledge, tools, and resources to cancer care providers and their practices to ensure care is evidence-based and results in optimal health outcomes and patient experience.

#### ■ GENERAL MISSION SUPPORT

Provide unrestricted, flexible funding to support Conquer Cancer's mission and vision. This funding allows us to be responsive to emerging needs in the field.

#### ■ MISSION ENDOWMENT

Conquer Cancer's Mission Endowment supports mission-critical programs at Conquer Cancer and ASCO. Every program funded by the Mission Endowment must align with one of the Endowment's funding pillars: research, education, quality, or current and emerging needs.



## CONQUER CANCER SUPPORT OPPORTUNITIES

### GRANTS AND AWARDS

#### ■ **ADVANCED CLINICAL RESEARCH AWARD**

The Advanced Clinical Research Award (ACRA) is a three-year \$450,000 grant that provides research funding to mid-career clinical investigators to perform original research in an area not currently funded.

**Annual Award Amount: \$500,000**

**Amount to Endow: \$13,500,000**

#### ■ **ANNUAL MEETING RESEARCH AWARD**

The Annual Meeting Research Award (AMRA) is a supplemental award for ASCO's Medical Student and Resident Research Forum participants with high-ranking research submissions. Awardees are required to attend the ASCO Annual Meeting where they will have opportunities to hear the latest advances in cancer research and present their research at the Research Forum.

**Annual Award Amount: \$1,700**

**Amount to Endow: \$59,500**

#### ■ **ASCO CLINICAL ONCOLOGY AND RESEARCH EXPERIENCE**

The ASCO Clinical Oncology & Research Experience (ASCO CORE) aims to introduce medical students to the field of oncology and provide them with critical exposure to cancer topics, research, and patient care through an immersive shadowing experience.

**Annual Award Amount: \$8,900**

**Amount to Endow: \$222,500**

#### ■ **CAREER DEVELOPMENT AWARD**

The Career Development Award (CDA) is a three-year \$200,000 mentored grant that provides research funding to clinical investigators in the first to fourth year of faculty appointment to establish an independent clinical cancer research program.

**Annual Award Amount: \$230,000**

**Amount to Endow: \$5,500,000**

#### ■ **GLOBAL ONCOLOGY YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARD**

The Global Oncology Young Investigator Award (GO YIA) provides research funding to early-career investigators to encourage and promote quality research in global oncology and to develop the next generation of researchers to address global health needs.

**Annual Award Amount: \$57,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$1,350,000**

#### ■ **INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND EDUCATION AWARD**

The International Development and Education Award (IDEA) provides support for early-career oncologists in low- and middle-income countries and facilitates the sharing of knowledge between these oncologists and members.

**Annual Award Amount: \$12,700**

**Amount to Endow: \$380,000**

### ■ INTERNATIONAL INNOVATION GRANT

The International Innovation Grant (IIG) provides research funding up to \$20,000 for one year to support novel and innovative projects with the potential to advance cancer control in low- and middle-income countries as defined by the World Bank.

**Annual Award Amount: \$23,000**

**Amount to Endow: \$500,000**

### ■ LONG-TERM INTERNATIONAL FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

The Long-term International Fellowship (LIFe) provides early-career oncologists in low- to middle-income countries with resources and support for advanced training.

**Annual Award Amount: \$75,000**

**Amount to Endow: \$1,875,000**

### ■ MERIT AWARD

Merit Awards are awarded to eligible first authors whose research is addressed in high-quality abstracts submitted to an ASCO Meeting and recognized for its scientific merit.

**Annual Award Amount: \$1,250**

**Amount to Endow: \$40,000**

### ■ RESEARCH PROFESSORSHIP

The Research Professorship provides funding to full professors who have made significant contributions to cancer research and are dedicated to mentoring the next generation of researchers.

**Annual Award Amount: \$550,000**

**Amount to Endow: \$14,500,000**

### ■ YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARD

The Young Investigator Award (YIA) is a one-year \$50,000 mentored grant that provides research funding to promising young investigators during the final years of training to support the transition to a faculty appointment and to encourage quality research in clinical oncology.

**Annual Award Amount: \$57,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$1,350,000**



## SPECIAL AWARDS

### ■ BRIGID LEVENTHAL SPECIAL MERIT AWARD

This award is given to the eligible First Author who submitted the top abstract in Pediatric Oncology as determined by the Scientific Program Committee.

**Annual Award Amount: \$1,250**

**Amount to Endow: \$40,000**

### ■ PAIN AND SYMPTOM MANAGEMENT SPECIAL MERIT AWARD

This award is given to the eligible First Author who submitted the top abstract in Pain and Symptom Management Research as determined by the Scientific Program Committee.

**Annual Award Amount: \$1,250**

**Amount to Endow: \$40,000**

### ■ ALLEN LICHTER VISIONARY LEADER AWARD

This award recognizes ASCO members who have demonstrated innovative and inspirational leadership to significantly advance the mission of ASCO and transform oncology and the overall cancer community.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

### ■ ASCO-AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY CANCER PREVENTION AWARD

This award recognizes ASCO members who have made a significant contribution to cancer prevention and control research or practice.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

### ■ DAVID KARNOFSKY SCIENCE OF ONCOLOGY AWARD

This award recognizes oncologists who have made outstanding contributions to cancer research, diagnosis, and/or treatment of cancer.

**Annual Award Amount: \$32,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$925,000**

### ■ INTERNATIONAL WOMEN WHO CONQUER CANCER MENTORSHIP AWARD

The International Women Who Conquer Cancer Mentorship Award recognizes an extraordinary woman leader in oncology who has excelled as a mentor and has demonstrated outstanding commitment to the professional development of colleagues as clinicians, educators, and researchers in oncology.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

■ **JAMIE VAN ROENN EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AND MENTORSHIP AWARD**

This award recognizes individuals who have had a demonstrable impact on their trainees and individuals within their care teams and who have inspired and shaped the practice of cancer medicine.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

■ **HUMANITARIAN AWARD**

This award recognizes individuals who distinguish themselves through voluntary and non-compensated humanitarian endeavors or community service to enhance the health and well-being of individuals, communities, and oncology workplaces.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

■ **PATIENT ADVOCATE SPECIAL AWARD**

This award recognizes individuals whose grassroots efforts have significantly impacted public awareness about cancer, its causes, cures, or treatment, or activities that result in additional support either legislatively or fiscally for cancer research, treatment, prevention or care.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

■ **PEDIATRIC ONCOLOGY SPECIAL AWARD**

This award recognizes pediatric oncologists who have contributed outstanding scientific work—laboratory, clinical, or epidemiologic—of major importance to the field of pediatric oncology.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

■ **COMMUNITY LEGACY SPECIAL AWARD**

This award recognizes community oncologists who have made significant contributions to cancer care in their community through research, education, leadership/advocacy, promotion of high-quality care, and/or expanding access to care.

**Annual Award Amount: \$6,500**

**Amount to Endow: \$185,000**

### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

#### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

These programs are designed to equip oncology professionals with the essential knowledge and skills needed to lead effectively in a changing environment. These programs are tailored to meet specific leadership needs, including leading change in medical education, leading organizations, and international leadership.

#### PATIENT ADVOCATE PROGRAM BUNDLE

The Patient Advocate Program Bundle will provide support to patient advocates so that they may actively participate in ASCO and Conquer Cancer programs focused on education and professional development. The Bundle includes Patient Advocate Awards and support for the Patient Advocate Lounge.

#### WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP BUNDLE

The Women in Leadership Bundle supports the next generation of oncologists becoming leaders through networking and mentorship opportunities. The Bundle includes support for the International Women Who Conquer Cancer Mentorship Award, Women's Networking Center at ASCO Annual Meeting, and participant support for the Leadership Development Program.
